CONSENT AGENDA

Ty Jones reported on the financials as of March 31, 2021. Although this year has not been a typical year and therefore it is hard to compare to previous years, we are pretty close to where we need to be. The total revenue is down approximately \$350K from where we were last year and our total expenses are down about \$300K. Even though the figures are much lower, we are almost spot on to what we are bringing in to what we are putting out. Chad Williams moved, Jamie Holyoak seconded to approve the minutes from the January 20, 2021 Board of Directors Meeting, the financial report and the IHSAA Board of Directors Actions.

REPORT AGENDA

YEA Update

Julie Hammons reported the YEA account balance as of Monday, April 5, 2021 was \$4.827M and is continuing to do well. Thankfully the spring season for our jamborees was a bit more robust and we are currently wrapping those up. A board meeting is scheduled this spring via zoom and two main items of discussion will be disbursements back to schools and if schools should be allowed to exceed a 100% investment level.

Dairy West Update

Nothing new to report.

Officials Update

District III Basketball Commissioner, David Lee addressed the board with a few concerns including the low number of officials. The number of officials across the state continues to decline and this is becoming a problem with game coverage. Ty Jones will follow up with David within the next few days.

IHSAA Sports Medicine Advisory Committee Update

Ty Jones reported Dr. Angie Pellant resigned from our Sports Medicine Committee and Dr. Kaleb Redden will be the new advisor. Dr. Redden works at St. Luke's and is a family medicine specialist as well as an orthopedic doctor that specializes in sports medicine. We welcome Dr. Redden and look forward to working with him.

2021 Girls Real Dairy Shootout

Mike Federico stated there were several modifications made and precautions that had to be put into place for all of our winter tournaments. First and foremost, we need to send out kudos to our member schools. From the principals, superintendents and AD's to the parents, players and coaches; thank you for all of your hard work in finishing a season and being able to get to a culminating event. We know this has been a challenging year for everyone and we can't thank you all enough for the support we received.

The girls' state basketball tournament ended up being great. We had to make some changes to the format as well as game times to allow each venue to be cleared and cleaned between each game. Online ticketing worked well however, there were some challenges with the paper ticketing. Julie Hammons reported on the financials and stated we were down about \$12,000 compared to previous years but also stated that overall, even with all the adjustments and changes that had to be made, the tournaments ended up being such a great experience for the kids. Many thanks to all of our managers and workers for their time, effort and most importantly, their support.

2021 State Wrestling Tournament

Mike Federico reported State Wrestling, like all the other tournaments, looked a little different this year. Originally the tournament was to be held at Holt Arena but since they couldn't accommodate us, it had to be changed to the Ford Idaho Center. The format was also changed from a two-day tournament to a one-day tournament and although it had its challenges, it allowed for more spectators. Financially we were down about \$79,000 but given the circumstances, it went as well as could be expected.

2021 Boys Real Dairy Shootout

Julie Hammons reported the boys' basketball tournament was similar to the girls. We did make a change in ticketing and set up a will call ticket window for the distribution of the paper tickets at the Idaho Center. There were a few site changes that had to be made and a huge thank you to Rocky Mountain, Eagle, Columbia and Ridgevue High School that stepped up and agreed to host our 4A, 3A and 2A tournaments. Financials were reviewed and although the overall expenses were down, our revenue was also down. All in all, the tournaments were great and we are grateful to all of our managers for their dedication and hard work.

2021 State Debate

Julie Hammons reported State Debate was virtual this year, 100% online, and attendance was good although down a bit. A new platform, tabroom.com, was used in conjunction with NSDA campus and ran very smoothly. Julie acknowledged all of the debate coaches for their hard work and flexibility. She especially thanked Kyra Mauney from Renaissance High School and Donnie Drobny from Borah High School who both did an outstanding job with this event. Overall, the tournament was great and we are happy to be able to refund all of the entry fees.

2021 State Cheer and Dance

Julie Hammons reported there were many changes this year. The floor was turned 90 degrees and a judge platform was added. The format and performance times, along with team packet pick up, ticketing and awards presentation were all changed as well. Although, financially we were down about \$14,000 from last year, we came in above what was budgeted. The tournament went better than expected especially with all of the changes that took place and Julie stated we have the best cheer and dance crew and can't thank them enough for all they do.

Schools of Excellence – Mid Year Standings

Julie Hammons reported mid-year standings are posted on IHSAA website and encouraged all schools to take a look and let her know if there are any discrepancies.

Winter Concussion Numbers

Ali Tedford went over the winter concussion numbers stating they are really low. Not sure what to contribute that to but it is definitely a good thing.

- **Interscholastic Star Student Scholarship** – the application form is online and the deadline is April 10, 2021. If there are any issues or questions contact Mike Federico.
- **Winter Sportsmanship Awards** – the schools were recognized and are listed on our website.

IHSAA Awards cont.

- **Spirit of Sport** – nomination deadline is May 1, 2021 and need to be submitted to Julie Hammons. This award seeks to recognize a current coach or student that's left a lasting impression, has overcome adversity, or exemplifies the "spirit of the sport" in athletics or activities.
- **Official of the Year** – nominations are due May 1, 2021 and must be submitted to Julie Hammons by the District Board of Control.

Student Advisory Committee

Mike Federico reported the SAC has continued to meet via zoom this year and are currently planning a spring summit video conference. The video conference will consist of putting together 10-minute, short educational based videos for students that will be posted on YouTube. These videos will be based on leadership type topics and the links will be sent out to our member schools to be distributed to students. The SAC is also looking for new members for next year. Applications are on the website and are due May 1, 2021. If you have any questions contact Mike.

The final decision in setting sites, dates and time for each state championship game will be made by IHSAA Representatives and will be finalized by 10:00 a.m. the Sunday prior to the state championship game.

Selection Criteria:

- A. Factors determining the site of a state championship game are:
 1. Idaho State University – There may be at least three games, and possibly four, scheduled at Holt Arena. Two games should be scheduled on Friday. The remaining game or games will be scheduled on Thursday or Saturday, with times to be determined by ISU’s football schedule.
 2. University of Idaho — There may be a maximum of three games per day scheduled at the Kibbie Dome. If possible, games should be scheduled for Friday afternoon and evening. Game times and dates will be determined by U of I’s football schedule.
 3. Boise State University — There may be two games per day played at Dona Larson/ Albertsons Stadium. Game times and dates will be determined by the Boise State football schedule.
- B. Other factors determining the site of a state championship game are:
 1. Travel - loss of instruction time for the two participating teams.
 2. Geographical rotation based upon recent participation of the district from which the teams are participating.
 3. A region may not host a state championship game two years in a row unless both teams are from the same region
 4. If No. 2 and No. 3 are in conflict with each other, No. 3 will take precedence over No. 2.
 5. Availability of lodging and meals for teams, support groups and spectators.
 6. Availability of the site to set reasonable game times. No game may be scheduled to start after 9:00 p.m. The team traveling the farthest distance will get first choice of game time.

DISCUSSION AGENDA

1. Dragon Fly – A proposal was made to begin using Dragon Fly for only officials beginning the summer of 2022. After further discussion it was decided to have some training sessions set up this summer and revisited this subject this fall. No Action Taken.

2. Petitioning Process – This subject was discussed in length with several suggestions made including not allowing petitioning and work with conferences for flexibilities.

A motion was made to move amending rule 2-3-2, eliminating 2-3-2b, to the June Action Agenda as a First Reading.

Petitioning Process will be left on the Discussion Agenda for the June 2021 Board of Directors Meeting.

3. District Set Up – After much discussion it was decided that IHSAA was not going to tell other conferences or districts what to do, but will just have an avenue to qualify for state. No Action Taken.

4. Adrian High School – A request from Adrian High School wanting to become a member school was discussed and the following items would need to be submitted before the board could make a decision: 1) approval from the conference they are currently in and the ok for the change 2) approval from the conference they are wanting to join - which is the 1AWIC of Idaho and 3) approval from the Oregon State Association. No Action Taken.

5. Speech Arts - A motion was made to move amending Rule 5.5 Octafinal Debate Bracket to the June Action Agenda as a First Reading.

If sixteen or less entries qualify for the state tournament in a single debate event, entries will receive “octafinalist points” toward sweepstakes if they advance to the semi-final round. In this case, the octafinal round will not occur.

RULE 13 - PHYSICAL EXAMS

- 13-1 Students are required to undergo a physical examination (9th and 11th grade) or complete an *Interim Questionnaire* (10th and 12th grade), and have it on file with the school prior to their first practice in any IHSAA sponsored sport, cheerleading, or dance activity. Forms are available online at idhsaa.org.
- 13-2 Physical exams must be taken and on file with the school prior to the first day of practice in the 9th and 11th grades. Any physical taken before May 1 of the 8th grade year will not be accepted.
- 13-3 Physicals are required in the 9th and 11th grade year. Students who have a physical in their 10th grade year must have another for the 11th grade. Students will not be required to take an additional physical examination during the 10th and 12th grades unless:
1. The physician recommends the student have an additional examination.
 2. The parents request an examination in the *Interim Questionnaire*.
 3. Affirmative answers on 1-10 of the *Interim Questionnaire* indicate a possible need for a repeat physical examination.
 4. A student has transferred to Idaho from another state.
- 13-4 Physical exams must be conducted by a licensed physician, physician's assistant or nurse practitioner.
- 13-5 The *Interim Questionnaire* must be completed by the parents/guardians of the athlete during the 10th and 12th grade years. The form must be on file in the administrator's office prior to the first day of practice.
- 13-5-1 It is the principal's responsibility to consult with the physician regarding any answers to questions on the *Interim Questionnaire* that may indicate a possible need for a repeat physical examination.

RULE 6 - CONTRACTS

- 6-1 The *Interscholastic Activities Contract* must be used to arrange varsity contests in football, volleyball, soccer, basketball, and wrestling. The principal or activities director of each school must sign the contract. When a school has two or more teams competing in the same sport, the teams must be clearly designated as "first", "second", or "third" team. (See contract form for additional information.)
- 6-2 If the contract is breached by either party, the IHSAA Board of Directors or District Board of Control, whichever is appropriate, will determine reasonable damages to be paid to the contracted opponent by the school that breaches the contract. In no case will the damages exceed three times the Association annual membership fee. The Board will not review oral contracts.
- 6-3 Contracts may be cancelled by mutual written consent of the contracting schools.
- 6-4 The Board of Directors may cancel any contest or contract if the Board determines that the contest should not be held because of death, fire, flood, disease, abandonment of an activity, or other reasons of impossibility of performance. No contest shall be ruled a forfeit until the Board has reviewed the facts of each case.

Rule 17-2-4

CURRENTLY IN RULES & REGULATIONS

17-2-4 Coaching Limitations – *Waived for 2020-21

- a. Coaches are not allowed to coach students of the school competitively (during competition) from August 3 to the start of that sport season during the school year. *Coaches, athletic trainers, or other school personnel cannot contact students during that same time. Winter and spring activities can contact students after the last starting date for fall activity practices.
- b. Schools will determine a 3-day, consecutive no contact period over winter break and notify the IHSAA of those dates through their fall School Directory update.

APPROVED FOR 2021-2022 SCHOOL YEAR

17-2-4 Coaching Limitations

- a. Coaches are not allowed to coach students of the school during the following times:
 - 1) The 7 consecutive days prior to the Fall Practice start date listed in the IHSAA calendar.
 - 2) The 3-day, consecutive no contact period during the winter break
 - 3) Winter and spring activity coaches may contact students after the Fall Practice start date.
- b. Sport specific activities lead by coaches, captains, volunteers or parents such as practices, retreats, camps, weight room and conditioning/workouts are prohibited 7 days prior to the Fall Practice start date.
- c. Meetings with medical professionals, parent meetings, registration, equipment handout and fundraising are allowed. These meetings shall be non-mandatory
