REPORT AGENDA

YEA Update

Julie Hammons reported the YEA portfolio was just slightly over \$4 million. As of October 31, 2022 the total was \$4,077,303 and is holding steady. We had a really good jamboree season. There were 32 fall jamborees bringing in an income of a little over \$18,000. For winter, there are currently 33 scheduled with a projected income of approximately \$15,000. The total number of fully vested schools is 73 with 10 schools at 80% vestment or higher. The YEA Board members are reaching out to community members for donations and recently received \$9,000 which was donated to Boise High School helping them reach the fully vested status. They are also applying for a business foundation grant and if approved, that will also be donated to a member school.

Dairy West Update

Ty Jones reported on Dairy West stating we are very pleased to be going into our 39th year of partnership with them. We have just received our contract and have begun the initial review but are not anticipating any major changes. We are thankful they continue to be an outstanding supporter!

Officials Update

Ty Jones presented a letter from Officials Committee Board member, Darren Malm. The letter addressed a few concerns which included the implementation of Dragon Fly, the card language in Rule 4.3 and administration procedures with regular season and state playoffs.

Marketing Update

Zach Hoffman gave the marketing update reiterating we are entering our 39th year with Dairy West and are in the process of finalizing the contract. The Idaho Department of Highway Safety is another additional sponsor that we have just brought on board and they will help sponsor our Student Advisory Council's summit this spring.

2022 State Fall Golf

Julie Hammons reported on State Fall Golf. We are very thankful for the courses that partner with us. We designate \$1200 per course, which is not a lot, and looking into the future is something that we should look at increasing. We had great weather and the feedback was mainly positive. The one issue and biggest complaint came from parents regarding student golfers not being able to compete in outside tournaments. Overall, it was a good change.

2022 State Soccer

Julie Hammons reported on State Soccer. This year the tournaments were split up with the 3A's in Twin Falls at Sunway Soccer Complex; the 4A's were up north at Real Life Turf Fields and 5A's were in eastern Idaho. All of the managers did an outstanding job and we had some good numbers financially. The MaxPreps Fall Seeding Review was discussed and it was stated the soccer coaches are not really thrilled about using MaxPreps. Even though the weather wasn't the best, we ended up having some really great tournaments.

2022 State Cross Country

Ty Jones reported State Cross Country was held up in Lewiston this year and thanked everyone that helped with this event. We were able to negotiate with LCSC to not charge for parking so we could charge a gate and that helped with the financials. Overall, it was a fantastic event; the timing system worked and the weather was great.

2022 State Volleyball Tournament

Mike Federico reported on State Volleyball stating it was held in District VI this year and gave a huge thank you to all of the managers. They all did a fantastic job and we couldn't do what we do without them. A couple of the sites didn't have a pixelot and that created few issues with not being able to broadcast all the games. The officials reported there were only two yellow cards given throughout the entire tournament which is outstanding.

2022 State Swim Meet

Julie Hammons reported on State Swim stating there were over 600 kids that participated and tickets sold out quickly. Ticketing was a bit of a struggle and we did our best to get people in. Unfortunately, the West YMCA is the largest facility in the state right now with a total capacity of only 450. We split 4A/5A and cleared the facility in between and opened the doors so parents could watch. Although there are some limitations, we are very grateful for the West YMCA and all of the support they provide.

2022 State Football Playoffs & Milk Bowl

Ty Jones went over the MaxPreps Fall Seeding Review for 2022 stating the AD's and football coaches did a good job setting up the brackets. Out of all the teams that played, the teams ranked 1 through 4 finished in the top four. The financials for state football are not yet complete but should be finalized by the January meeting. Ty thanked all of the managers stating they did an outstanding job and overall, we had some great games with minimal issues.

2022 State Drama

Ty Jones reported on State Drama stating it was held at Coeur d'Alene High School this year and there were around 600 students participating. Travel to the event was a little challenging for some since the weather did not cooperate causing some road closures. Jared Helm and Allison Knoll did an outstanding job and it turned out to be a fantastic tournament.

Fall Academic Champions

Julie Hammons reported the Fall Academic Champions are posted on our website ~ Congratulations to all the schools! The deadline will be moved up a bit earlier next year so there is time to compile everything before state golf.

Schools of Excellence – Fall Standings

Julie Hammons stated the mid-year standing are posted on our website. Please check the numbers and points to make sure they are correct.

Statewide Football Bracketing Meeting

Ted Reynolds reported the statewide football bracketing meeting was well attended and brackets have been submitted. There were a couple of issues that were brought up concerning MaxPreps, and the 60/40 revenue split. There was a lot of good discussion and it all went well.

Ty Jones went over the Fall 2022 stating there are still 20 schools that have not turned in numbers. We will be sending out reminders and then fines will be implemented.

Committee Reports

- **State Tournament** – The fall tournaments were reviewed along with the winter tournament sites.
 - State Wrestling - schedule has been set and will be sent out. There will be a 16-person girl bracket this year with 12 weights.
 - State Volleyball – roster limit was increased from 12 to 15 for all classifications.
 - State Track – 4A/5A will be held at Mt. View this year with Eagle as the backup.
 - State Dance/Cheer – 2024/2025 dates will change.
 - State Cross Country – next year will be held at Portneuf in Pocatello; the next year at Eagle Island and then fall back into the rotation.
- **Representation** – reviewed the representation that was set last year.
- **Student Advisory** – William Tadge reported the Student Advisory Council stating they had their fall planning meeting and are currently working on the spring summits. They are super excited to have the Idaho Department of Highway Safety sponsor them this year. They are also continuing the Battle of the Fans competition and are hoping to get some good participation with that this year.
- **Sportsmanship** – Mike Federico reported the sportsmanship committee met in November and had a lot of really good discussions. Language was added to the sportsmanship manual regarding video boards and some topics of discussion included the “Bench Bad Behavior” rule kit, Rule 4-3 and the benefits of having students read the sportsmanship announcements. There was an emphasis on Rule 9 which is keeping people off the field or court until the officials and the other team have had a chance to exit.

Policy Manual/Legal Updates

Ty Jones stated the policy manual discussion was about eligibilities and we walked through a few different scenarios pointing out what to look for.

Rule 8-14-1

A motion was made to approve modifying Rule 8-14-1 as a First Reading.

8-14-1 Bona Fide Move If the parents of a student, or legal guardian in case neither parent is living, make a bona fide move to a new permanent residence in the attendance area of a school to which the student transfers, he/she is immediately eligible provided an ***Athletic Transfer Form*** is submitted and approved. A permanent residence is the actual physical relocation by the parents or legal guardians of a student at a new residence and termination of all occupancy of the previous residence. The change in residence must be bona fide and used as the address for utilities, registration for voting, registration for driver's licenses, registration for motor vehicles, identification cards, and the attendance zone for other school aged family members for a minimum of 365 days. For the purpose of eligibility, there can be only one residence.

Move Less Than 50 Miles If the parents of a student move less than fifty miles from their present residence, the follow information must accompany the Athletic Transfer Form:

1. Letter from parents explaining the move.
2. Letter of support from school filing the request.
3. Proof of former residence address being terminated (lease termination letter, escrow closing papers).
4. Real estate documents indicating and verifying the valid change of residence OR proof of entering a long-term lease (minimum of 12 months).
5. Proof of at least two utility services/monthly bills in the family's name at the new residence address **AND** documentation of termination of the same at the former address (cell phone, auto insurance, pay stub, gas, water, electricity, cable TV, etc.)
6. Proof of change in address on the parent(s) and age-appropriate student's driver's license to new residence address.

The IHSAA Executive staff or Board of Directors may approve or deny varsity competition if circumstances warrant.

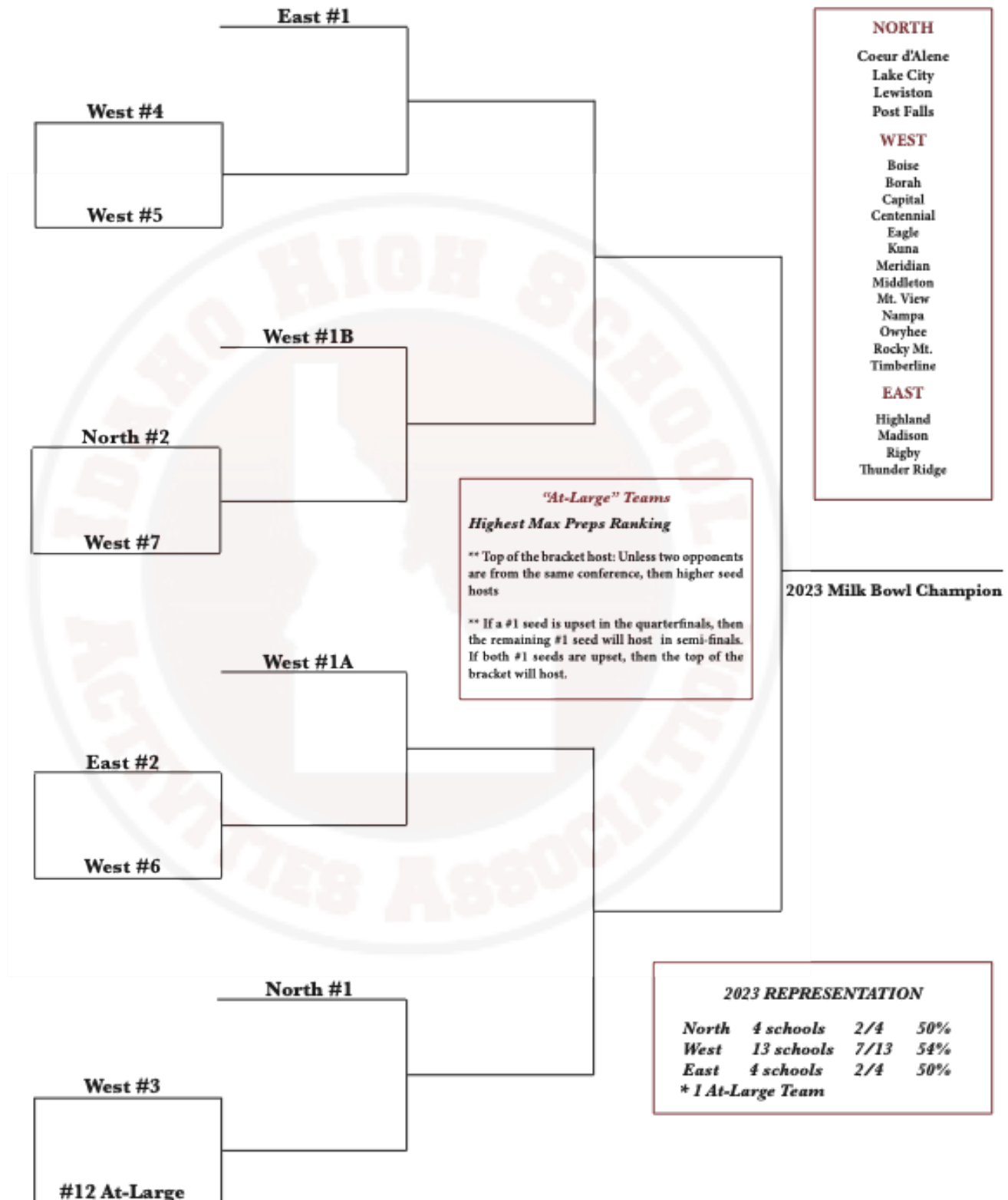

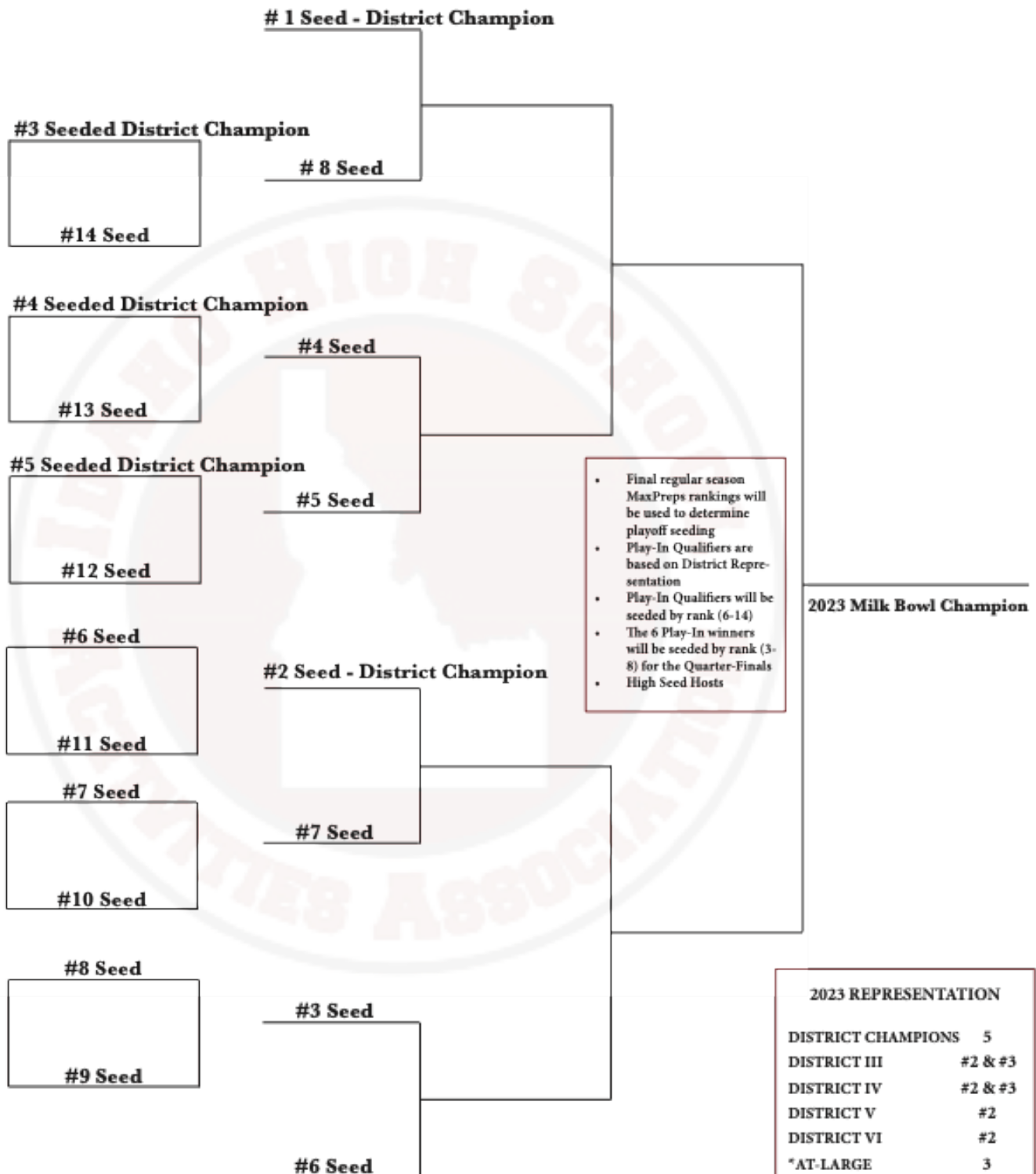

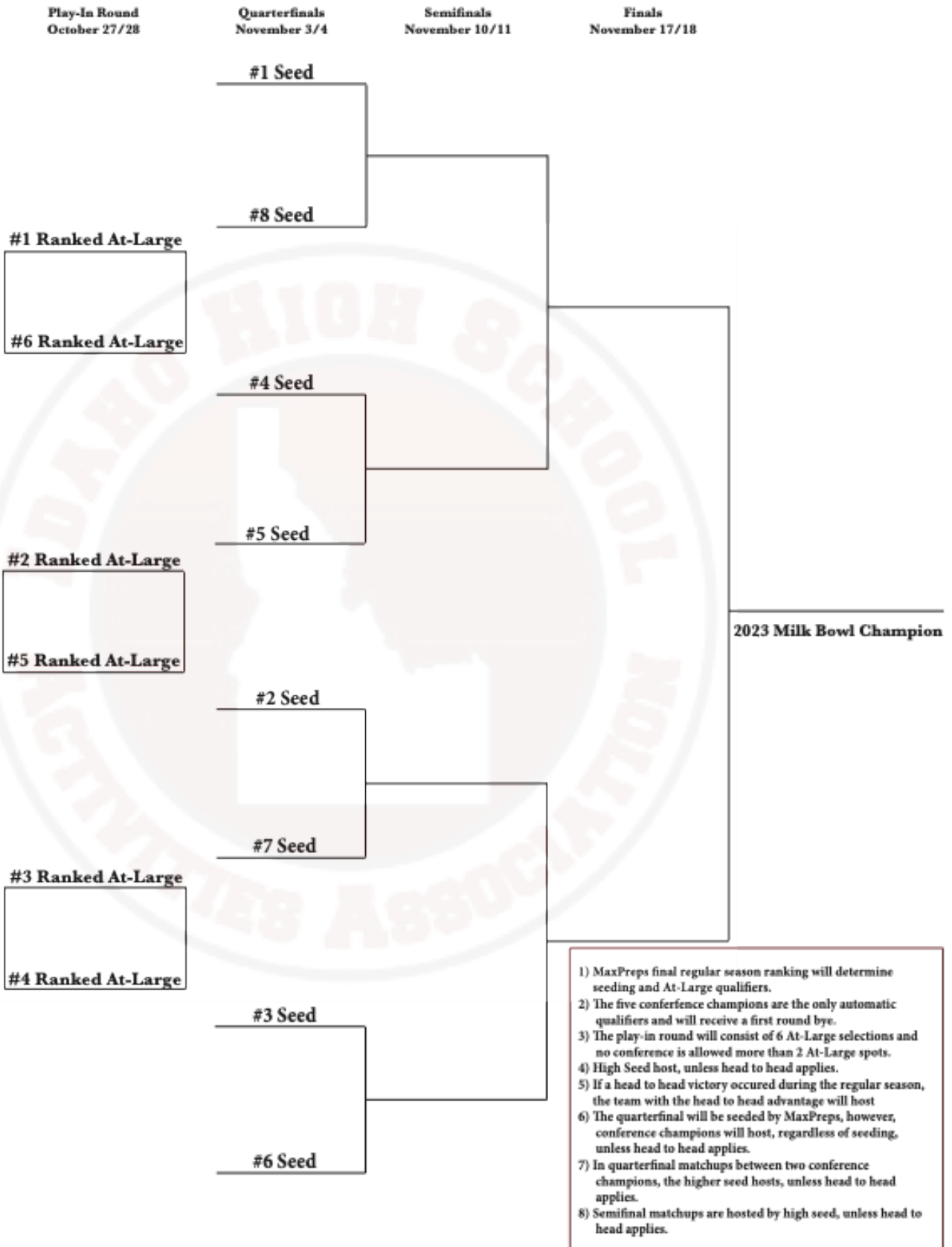

2023 2A IHSAA State Football Bracket



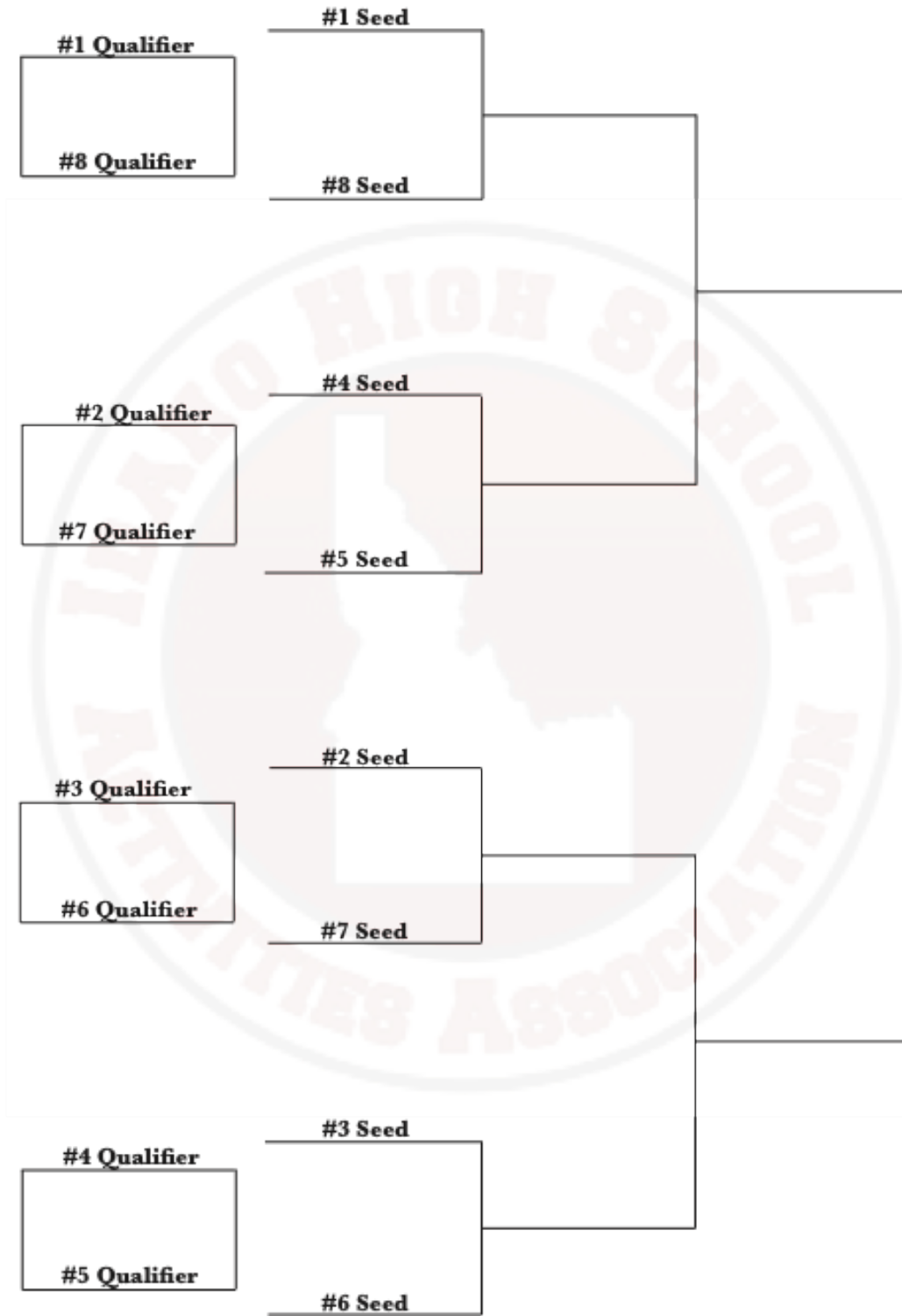
