Ty Jones reported on the financials stating the report is not yet complete and should be finalized the beginning of July. We are still waiting on some bills and sponsorship money to come in. The end of year was pretty strong although our contingency fund is down about \$20,000 from where it was nine months ago. There has been some fluctuation in the stock market but we are confident it will come back. Revenue looks pretty good. Activities did really well. Expenses increased quite a bit due to travel, hotels and the 10% raise for officials. Overall, it was an expensive year but a good year.

REPORT AGENDA

YEA Update

Julie Hammonds reported on the YEA stating the fund, as of June 2, 2022, was at \$4.452 million. Disbursement total is estimated to be a little over \$155,000. Congratulations to Deary High School for becoming fully vested bringing the total of vested schools to 72. A couple of changes from the last board meeting were made. First, beginning fall 2022, all jamborees must charge a minimum admission fee of \$5 for adults/\$2 students. If a school is not able to have a gate, there will be a flat rate charge. Those schools will need to contact Julie Hammons to discuss. Second, beginning fiscal year 2022-23, the YEA will disburse 4% of the fund balance on June 30th. The first 3.5% will be disbursed as it has been and the additional .5% will be divided evenly among all vested schools.

Dairy West Update

Ty Jones reported on Dairy West stating they have been a fantastic sponsor and we are pleased to continue our partnership with them ~ going into our 39^{th} year. Sweatshirt numbers were discussed along with milk crews. They are also working on streamlining their Dairy passes.

Marketing Update

Zach Hoffman gave the marketing update stating the Athlete of the Week program, sponsored by Toyota, went really well. There were close to 400 nominations in just the short time the program ran \sim which is outstanding. A big thank you to everyone that participated and sent in nominations. The sponsorship with Biden has been renewed through 2025 and we are currently in the process of renewing sponsorships with McU Sports and the Army National Guard. A new program sponsored by Les Schwab will be starting this fall; the Team of the Month. This program will be similar to the Athlete of the Week but will be highlighting outstanding teams. More information to come.

Officials Update

Darren Krzesnik gave the officials update expressing gratitude to the board for waiving the fees for the first- and second-year officials hoping this will help with recruiting. Darren also addressed a few concerns that included the 4-3 Rule and training for the shot clocks.



XVI. Pep Band Policy for district tournaments, playoffs, and state tournaments.

- Definition: an instrumental music group from the school's music program designed specifically to perform before games, between quarters, at time outs, and halftime. The band must contain typical pep band instrumentation (flute, saxophone, trumpet, etc. – keyboards and guitars are allowed)
- 2. All pep bands must make previous arrangements with the site director. The site director will arrange for admission either by passes, gate list, or other means.
- 3. The pep band must be under the direction of the school band director or his/her designee.
- 4. When a pep band is present, recorded music is not to be played over the speaker system unless the band chooses not to play. The band director will check in with the site host upon arrival.
- 5. Bands are allowed to play up to 20 minutes prior to the game (during warm-up time), between quarters, time-outs, and halftime if no other group is performing.
- 6. Bands may play their school fight song immediately following the announcement of their team's starting lineup. Band directors will need to communicate with the announcer if they choose to do this.
- Band directors need to communicate with the site host, tournament manager, or announcer to determine if announcements are needed during halftime or at quarters.
- 8. When two bands are present:
 - a. The home team school will play the national anthem. Both bands should come prepared to play the national anthem.
 - b. Bands are to alternate playing times, every other time out, every other quarter. During warm-ups and halftime bands should alternate every song. Upon arrival, the band directors are responsible to communicate and determine who will play first.
- 9. Bands are not to play instruments while the ball is in play. Band directors should be aware of the game and be prepared to stop the group when play resumes.
- 10. Immediately after the final buzzer, the winning team's band may play their school's fight song or another victory song of their choice. The losing team's band may play their school's fight song afterwards.
