IHSAA Rule of the Month

17-2-3 Open Gym/Field/Facility

17-2-3 Open Gym/Field/Facility-Open Gym/Field/Facility does not violate IHSAA rules if the following conditions are met:

- a. Coaches supervise only. Coaches may NOT instruct/plan/ organize/teach or coach.
- b. Coaches are allowed to coach/instruct any number of students on individual skills and development specific to their sport. Maximum of 10 hours per school year.
- c. Sessions do NOT count as required practice time prior to the season.
- d. Scrimmages and/or team competition against anyone that is not enrolled at the school are NOT allowed.
- e. Schools may petition the IHSAA to allow coaches to coach individuals during competitions that are qualifying events.
- f. Participants, coaches and/or schools are NOT covered under IHSAA catastrophic insurance plan.
- g. Administrative approval of Open Gym/Field/Facility hours and weeks is required from the school Principal or Athletic Director.

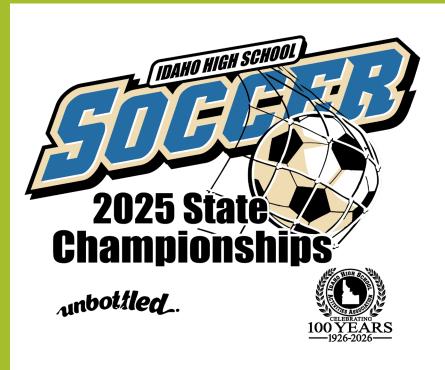

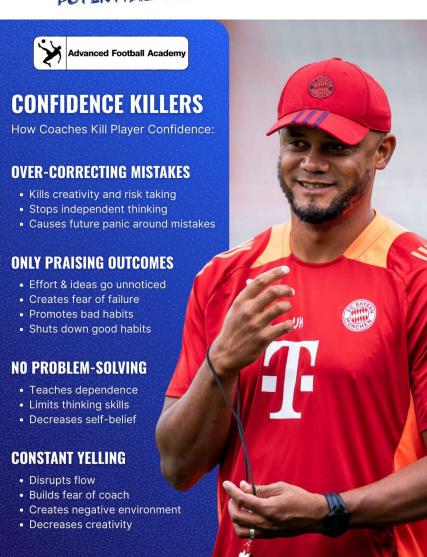

C o m m u n i c a t i o n is one of the most important qualities of high-performing coaching staffs. But it's not just about more communication; it's about the right kind of

communication. As with most things, quality matters more than quantity.

To ensure your communication is high-quality, think of the acronym **PACT**:

P- People

Make sure the right people are getting the information. Whenever you receive information, ask yourself, "Who else needs to know this?"

A - Accurate

Ensure the information is correct. There is non-information (what everyone already knows), misinformation (incorrect information), and accurate information (what is both true and relevant). Aim for accuracy.

C - Clear

Avoid jargon and complexity. The goal is not to sound smart; it is to be understood. Communicate so clearly that others cannot misunderstand it.

T – Timely

Timing matters. Information that arrives too late loses is costly. Communicate at the right time, when it can make the greatest impact.

When communication is shared with the right people, is accurate, clear, and timely, that is when a coaching staff builds alignment, trust, and momentum.

Don't Let the Big Trophies Get in the Way of the Living Trophies

In the end, leadership is about far more than the scoreboard or the title. It's about people. It's about presence.



Jay Wright, Villanova's former men's basketball coach, now a college basketball analyst for CBS and Turner during March Madness, has always been more than an elite coach.

His accolades are forever etched in the record books and the halls of the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Massachusetts.

2 NCAA National Championships (2016, 2018). 4 Final Four appearances (2009, 2016, 2018, 2022). Multiple Big East regular season and tournament titles. Coach of the Year honors.

In his New York Times bestselling book Attitude: Develop a Winning Mindset On and Off the Court, he shared "some of the leadership secrets that enabled Villanova, a private university with an undergraduate enrollment of less than 6,500, to thrive in the hypercompetitive world of college athletics." Yet beyond the banners and the brilliance, what makes Coach Jay Wright extraordinary and dynamic isn't just the wins. It's his ability to see people.

His GQ style and tailored suits may turn heads, but it's his authenticity, charisma, and warmth that leave hearts changed. When you're in his presence, you feel seen and heard — a rare gift that can't be faked, only felt.

Coach Jay Wright is known not just for winning but for how he won.

Recently, Coach Wright reflected on his dear friend, mentor, and our late great co-founder, "Coach" George Raveling. The two men shared much in common, a deep love for Villanova University, the city of Philly, and an uncommon ability as leaders, coaches, and positive difference-makers to make others feel seen, heard, and valued.

As Coach Wright reminisced on Coach Raveling's remarkable and meaningful 88-year life — from Villanova student-athlete to Villanova assistant coach, to barrier-breaking college basketball head coach, to culture-shifting, transcendent Nike executive — he said something simply profound:

"Coach Raveling lived his life in a way where he didn't let the big trophies get in the way of the living trophies."

Let's read that again: Don't let the big trophies get in the way of the living trophies.

The Big Trophies vs. The Living Trophies

The big trophies represent external achievements — championships, awards, titles, financial success, and recognition. They're shiny, symbolic, and significant. But they're also temporary. Because when our time on Earth comes to an end and we're called home, none of those trophies come with us.

What endures are the living trophies.

The living trophies are the people we lead, coach, and influence — the ones whose lives are better because we invested in them. They are the human outcomes of leadership: character, belonging, confidence, psychological safety, resilience, connection, trust, integrity, compassion, accountability, humility, grace, and attitude.

A living trophy is a person who carries your lessons forward, who leads others, raises families, serves communities, and embodies what you taught long after the scoreboard fades to black.

Re-Aligning What Matters Most

For some, the big and living trophies are aligned. They still remember their why. For others, the pursuit of winning has clouded the soul of their leadership. Yet wherever we stand today, with the gift of life, we have the ability to change and course-correct.

In today's culture of "what have you done for me lately," where wins, metrics and margins dominate, we risk dehumanizing the very people who make winning possible. We forget that the true measure of leadership isn't what we achieve, it's who we evolve into and who we build up and transform along the way.

Whether this message finds you in a season of ascent or a valley of reflection, may it serve as a call to realign the strategy of leadership with the soul of leadership.

Practicing the Living Trophy Mindset

- *Prioritize people over outcomes.* Win hearts before you win games.
- Celebrate growth, not just results. Culture is built on quiet breakthroughs, not just big moments.
- See potential as sacred. Every person you coach is a reflection of your leadership.
- Lead with legacy in mind. Ask yourself: Will the people I lead become better humans because of my presence, long after I'm gone? When we pause to reflect on the highs and lows, the grief and joy, the duality of it all, we realize that life is fleeting, no matter the preciousness of our longevity. We are all merely passing through.

And when our bodies come to rest, what will matter most are not the big trophies, but the living ones — the ones who felt seen, heard, loved, and valued because we lived. The ones who found their light again because we believed in them and offered hope.

In the end, leadership is about far more than the scoreboard or the title. It's about people. It's about presence. It's about how our love, grace, and wisdom echo in the lives we've touched and transformed.

As Coach Raveling would often remind us: "With this new day, I can choose to be happy — or very happy." And just like him and Coach Jay Wright, we can choose to invest in what truly endures today: *our living trophies*.

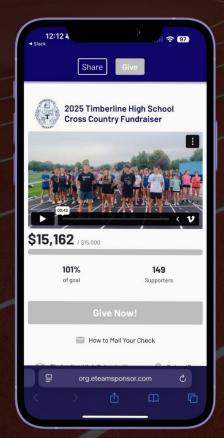

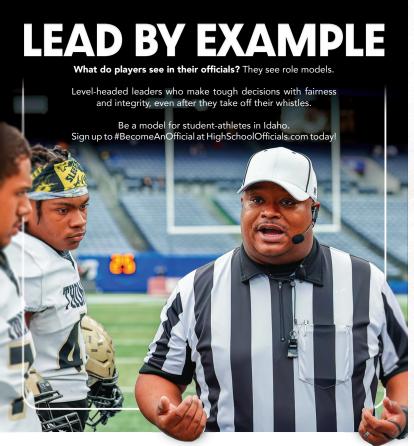

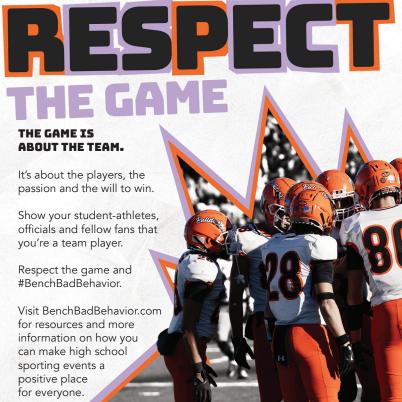
