22-23 Points of Emphasis

Officials Shortage:

- o Data shows an increase in officials state-wide
 - Officials report that the elimination of fees for 1st and 2nd year officials is working
- Work is needed to retain officials.

Review of Rule 4-3:

o Recommendation to remove Rule 4-3-3b. (give 4-3 card prior to leaving event)

Student Reading Sportsmanship Announcements:

 - Recommendation to continue practice and expand message and methodology

- Gregg Baczuk reported on the pilot program at Skyline HS. Gregg gives officials an opportunity to provide feedback about the coaches, players, parents and student section when it comes to behaviors displayed at games. Evidence did support where sportsmanship was positive and areas of improvement.

IHSAA Items

Staff:

Rule Change - 3-1-2:

o Board of Directors approved non-certified teachers that are coaches are required to take the "Teaching and Modeling Behavior" course from the NFHS.

Student Advisory Committee:

- o Battle of the Fans contest deadline is March 1, 2024 Information is on the IHSAA Student Page
- o Reported on the Fall Sportsmanship Symposium
- o SAC plans to have spring Lead & Achieve Summit in every district
- Student Lead Pre-game Sportsmanship Announcements Student leaders reading the sportsmanship announcements prior to each game.
- o SAC behavior videos are in production

23-24 Discussion Items

Students Section Location:

- Location/logistics of student sections at sporting events were discussed. Recommendations included a request to the IAAA to create guidelines/considerations for school administrators when determining the location of student sections.
- o Possibly a break-out session at the IAAA Conference

Time-Out Idaho:

- O Discussion centered around a program that allows for a "Time-Out" to be called during a game in which the fan behavior is getting out of control.
 - Committee recommends to move forward with the idea; however, is concerned with logistics

Coaches Behavior:

- o Encourage students through the SAC to have players discuss coaching behaviors with administration
- o Have coaches be the example of sportsmanship with players, parents and officials
- o Encourage AD's to speak to students about appropriateness of speaking up

Parent Behavior:

- o One of the biggest issues facing member schools
 - Discussed adding two parents to the sportsmanship committee to represent and share message with parents. We will ask the newly formed parent committee for recommendations

Player Behavior:

o Encourage all coaches to recognize the importance and influence they have on the behavior of their players

 - o Turnover of school administration creates a need for mentoring and training with sportsmanship

 - Asked to encourage coaches to attend "in-person" rules clinics to communicate issues between officials and coaches

 - o Encouraged anyone to share acts of positive sportsmanship with the state

- District Tournament Sportsmanship Recognition
 - Present a sportsmanship t-shirt and certificate of appreciation at each district tournament to all member schools
- o Create common language for a state-wide sportsmanship campaign
 - SAC will begin this work
- o Digital advertising from the SAC on a state-wide and district level
- Create a "Strategic Student Section"
- Social Media Awareness for all student-athletes
 - Some school districts have policies in place
- Mental Health Education at sporting events
- o Change 4-3-3b requirement
- o Administration promoting Sportsmanship at all parent meetings
- Student Lead Sportsmanship Announcements
- o Focus on the Good"
 - Promotion of positive behaviors at events by fans, parents, students, coaches
- o Rotate the Sportsmanship Committee meetings around the state
- o Add two parents to the 24-25 Sportsmanship Committee as members
