TOURNAMENT SCHEDULE

Matches are assigned approximate times. If the tournament runs behind, managers may elect to revert to a "followed by" format. Players and coaches are responsible for checking the tournament's progress before leaving the site during a break. Players must be available at least 30 minutes prior to their assigned match time (except first match of the day) in case adjustments are necessary. Play begins at 8:00am both days. (First call 7:45am)

STATE TOURNAMENT GENERAL RULES & PROCEDURES

- 1. The state tournament consists of five events: boys singles, girls singles, boys doubles, girls doubles, and mixed doubles. A player may enter only one event.
- 2. USTA rules of play are followed at the state tournament with IHSAA modifications as specified below.
- 3. USTA officials will monitor play at each site to the extent possible.
- 4. Coaching by an *official school coach* during side changes is allowed provided no more than 1 1/2 minutes elapses. Coaching by an *official school coach* after split sets is allowed provided no more that 3 minutes elapses.
- 5. Coaches are not allowed inside the fence at outside courts unless requested for monitoring line calls. One *official school coach* may sit courtside at indoor facilities.
- 6. Spectators (including other players) shall remain outside the fence at outdoor sites and will not be permitted to sit courtside at indoor facilities.
- 7. Winners shall report score and return balls to tournament desk immediately following their match.
- 8. The server shall call the score prior to serving each point.
- 9. Players should be prompt and obvious indicating to their opponents when the ball is long or wide either verbally or by gesturing.
- 10. Officials or line-call monitors will be provided if requested by a player. Coaches must be available to monitor line calls only if an official is not available.

TENNIS BALLS

Three new balls will be provided for each match. Winners of the match must return balls to scorer's table before scores will be recorded.

TIME LIMITS

The following format, time limits and guidelines will be followed

- 1. 15 minutes Failure to report for match (after first call) DEFAULT
- 2. 10 minutes Warm-up (including serves)
- 3. 3 minutes Rest period for split sets
- 4. 45 minutes Maximum time between matches
- 5. 30 minutes Minimum time between matches
- 6. 10 minutes Maximum time allowed correcting improper dress

PENALTIES FOR UNSPORTSMANLIKE BEHAVIOR

The USTA Point Penalty System (PPS) will be used for penalizing unsportsmanlike conduct. Violation of the following behaviors may result in disqualification (default).

- 1. Repeated displays of poor sportsmanship
- 2. Racquet, court or ball abuse
- 3. Being disrespectful to or uncooperative with a tournament official
- 4. Using profane language and/or gestures
- 5. Persistent intentional distraction, taunting and/or disrespect of an opponent

RAIN-OUT PLAN

Tournament managers in case of delays from inclement weather or other unforeseen circumstances may adjust the tournament format. Adjustment priorities:

- a. Tournament may revert to "followed by" format.
- b. Tournament may move to indoor courts if available.
- c. No-ad scoring may be used, first in consolation brackets and then in championship brackets.
- d. 8-game pro-sets may be used in one or both brackets, tie-break at 7-all.
- e. If conditions on day one do not permit play, tournament management may elect to play single elimination on day two.
- f. If conditions on both days do not permit play, tournament will be canceled.
- g. Matches will not be assigned after 9:00 p.m. on first day or begin before 6:00 a.m. on the second day of the tournament.

^{*}Medical timeouts and Bleeding Timeouts will be monitored and regulated according to USTA Standards

SCORING

Matches will be the best of three tie-break sets regular scoring: 7-point set tie-break at 6 games all. All matches except the finals will be played with a 10-point tie-break in lieu of third set. The Consolation and Championship Finals (Matches 27 and 28) will be full third set matches.

7-POINT TIE-BREAK

When a set score reaches 6-all, a standard (ITF Rules of Tennis, 5b) 7-point Set Tie-break (13th game) will determine the set winner. Tie-breaks for both singles and doubles matches will follow regular procedure with players changing ends after every six points. During the tie-break, doubles players will maintain the same service order and receiver positions as previously established in the set.

MATCH TIE-BREAK (10 POINTS)

The player/doubles partners who first win(s) ten points or more, by a two-point margin, win(s) the match tie-break (3rd set) and the match. The 3rd set match tie-break also follows regular changeover procedure; players changing ends every six points. The original service order continues. However, in doubles, the order of serving and receiving within the team may be altered, as in the beginning of each set. Their doubles team service order and receiving positions then remain the same for the rest of the tie-break.

Points for team scoring shall be awarded as follows:

- a. Two (2) team points shall be scored for each match won in the championship bracket except for the final first-place match. If a bye is received in the first round, advancement points will be awarded only if the player(s) win the next match.
- b. One (1) team point shall be scored for each match won in the consolation bracket except for the final third place match. If a bye is received in the first consolation round, advancement points will be awarded only if the player(s) win the next match.
- c. Point(s) shall be scored for each match won by default, disqualification, or forfeit throughout the tournament.
- d. The top four finishers in each event will receive placement points as follows: Champions -14 points; 2nd place 10 points; 3rd place 7 points; 4th place 4 points.
- 3. Ties in team scores shall be broken by the most entries that play in the championship finals. If still tied, the number of entries that play in the consolation finals will be used.
- 4. Separate Boys and Girls Championships will be given. Points for mixed doubles will be split.

BRACKETS

The 6A/5A/4A tournaments will be seeded. See "Seeding Guidelines" adopted by the IHSAA (www.idhsaa.org).

ALTERNATES

In the event that a qualifier is unable to participate in the state tournament due to circumstances beyond the player's control, the following guidelines will be followed when substituting the district alternate:

- a. If seeded player drops:
 - 1. Take the 6 seeds, and remove student who is unable to play.
 - 2. Move the other seeds up one spot and pull up the #7 player into the #6 seed spot.
 - 3. Place district alternate into the group that will be drawn for spots #7-#16.
 - 4. Re-draw the bracket.
- b. If non-seeded player drops:
 - 1. The district alternate will be directly substituted into the draw.
 - 2. The alternate will take the same place in the draw as the player who became unable to play. The bracket will not be re-drawn.
- c. If one member of a doubles team is unable to participate, an alternate from that same school will be allowed to substitute on the doubles team, regardless of the district tournament results. The bracket will not be re-drawn.
- d. If both members of a doubles team are unable to participate, procedures a. and b. (above) will be followed.

Deadline for drops is the Wednesday prior to the tournament at noon. Any drops reported after the deadline will result in a first-round bye and no district alternates will be added.

AWARDS

Presentation of awards will take place at conclusion of championship matches in each classification at the primary tournament site.

- 1. Banners Awarded to championship boys and girls team in each classification
- 2. Trophies Awarded to first through fourth place boys and girls team in each classification
- 3. Medals Awarded to first through fourth place in each event

T-SHIRTS / SOUVENIR MERCHANDISE

McU Sports will sell souvenir t-shirts, sweatshirts, hats and other miscellaneous items at all primary sites.

UNIFORMS

Uniform rules are in effect for district and state tennis. Uniforms must be school-issued or school-approved.

Shirts/Tops

- 1. School name, school initials, or mascot name must be affixed to the shirt/top in a permanent/semi-permanent manner. (Cannot be made out of tape or paper, not be taped or glued on. Names or descriptions of sports other than tennis are not permitted on shirts/tops.)
- 2. Sleeveless shirts, scoop necks, t-backs, etc. are permitted. Tank tops that are baggy with unusually large armholes are not permitted.
- 3. Shirts/tops must be of sufficient length to cover the midriff when standing.
- 4. Commercial advertising is not permitted with the exception of a 21/4" x 21/4" logo.

Shorts/Skirts

Must be tennis-style and a solid color; nominal trim is allowed. (narrow trim and/or stripes)

Dresses

Tennis dresses are permitted provided top meets "shirt" requirements and bottom meets "shorts/skirts" requirement.

Shoes

Standard tennis shoes with non-marking soles must be worn.

Hats/Headbands/Wristbands

- 1. Standard baseball caps or visors are optional. If worn:
 - a. must be solid color (nominal trim is ok)
 - b. school name, initials, mascot, or small logo are permitted.
- 2. Headbands and wristbands must be of soft material and fit snugly.
- 3. Scarves are not allowed.
- 4. Bandannas may be worn only as an appropriate headband

<u>Sweats/Warm-ups</u>

Sweats/warm-ups may be worn in inclement weather. They may not display commercial advertising except small manufacturer's logo.

Visible Undergarments

Any visible garments (sleeves, sports bras, compression shorts, etc) that are worn under the shirt or shorts must be a solid color.

CROWD CONTROL/SPORTSMANSHIP

The practice of good sportsmanship by all participants, coaches, and fans is imperative. The IHSAA expects close supervision of students and adult fans and asks for the continued support and cooperation of administrators in enforcing all state tournament sportsmanship rules.

The following sportsmanship rules are in effect at all IHSAA state championship events:

- 1. <u>Face Painting</u>: Full and/or half face painting is not permitted. Partial face painting is permitted such as small markings on the cheeks, nose, or forehead.
- 2. <u>Posters/Banners/Signs</u>: All signs must show only positive support for one's own team. Those that direct negative comments towards opponents or are unsportsmanlike or vulgar are not permitted.
- 3. <u>Artificial Noisemakers</u>: Artificial noisemakers are prohibited. Artificial noisemakers are items such as (but not limited to) megaphones, air horns, bells, whistles, and clickers. Exception: Cheerleaders (only) may use megaphones at football games.
- 4. <u>Balloons</u>: Balloons are not permitted at any IHSAA state play off or championship event.
- 5. Attire: Bare chests are not permitted. Shirts must be worn.
- 6. <u>Inappropriate Behaviors</u>: The following behaviors are not permitted:
 - a. Throwing objects onto the playing area before, during, or after a contest.
 - b. Entering the playing area before, during, or after a contest.
 - c. Verbal harassment or derogatory remarks directed toward an opponent or official.
