

Diane Wolf – 2008 Hall of Fame Inductee



Diane Wolf spent twenty-three years teaching physical education, health, and student leadership at Meridian Junior High, and Meridian and Centennial High Schools. During those years she was head gymnastics (State Champions 1982) and cheerleading coach and an assistant coach in cross country, track, tennis, and volleyball. She served the IHSAA as Assistant Director and was responsible for the development of recognition programs for students, schools, and adults.

Her greatest impact has undoubtedly been in the area of spirit (cheer and dance). One of the nation's foremost authorities on cheerleading safety, Diane has served as both a regional representative and chair of the National Federation of State High School Association (NFHS) Spirit Rules Committee. She co-authored NFHS spirit coaches' education courses and has been a speaker, presenter, clinician, and technical judge at numerous local, state, regional, and national events. Diane retired in 2007, but continued her service to spirit as a consultant to the NFHS and as a state and national rules interpreter, clinician, and technical judge.
