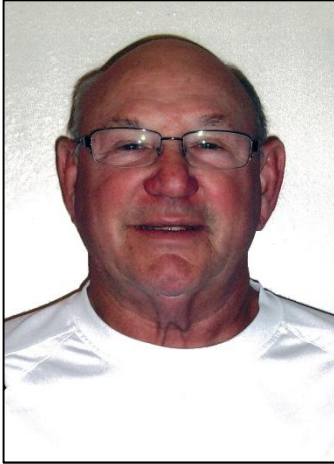


Jessie Eddy – 2012 Hall of Fame Inductee



Jessie Eddy worked tirelessly as an advocate for the students and athletes of Idaho for thirty-four years. Jessie's career began in Parma in 1969 where he was a physical education teacher, assistant football coach for five years, head wrestling coach for thirty-four years, and head tennis coach for twenty years.

Jessie's coaching records are staggering. His Parma wrestling teams racked up a dual record of 443-90-1 with twenty-six district championship titles, six state championships, and six runner-up titles. He also coached forty-four individual state champions and more than one hundred and seventy state-placers. In tennis, his teams had a combined record of 335-46-38 in duals, seven state championships and fourteen district championship titles. He was nominated for National Wrestling Coach of the Year in 1985 and was inducted into the National Wrestling Hall of Fame in 2006.
