

Terry Mooney - 2018 Hall of Fame Inductee



Terry Mooney has worked tirelessly as an advocate for the students and athletes of Idaho for forty years. Spending entire career working in the Weiser School District, he has held numerous teaching, coaching, and administrative positions. He truly was a “jack of all trades” and did whatever Weiser needed to help the students in his community. Over the course of his career he has taught driver’s education, elementary physical education, middle school social studies, migrant school classes, and high school history all while coaching football and baseball.

Terry’s peers have recognized his exceptional coaching skill and lifelong dedication to the student-athletes of Idaho by honoring him with numerous awards. He was named District Baseball Coach of the Year five times and in 1998 received the Idaho State Coaches Association Distinguished Baseball Coach of the Year award. Terry was also recognized for his work as an athletic director, receiving the District Athletic Director of the Year twice and the Idaho Athletic Administrators Association 3A Athletic Director of the Year in 2009. Terry received the Charles Alvaro Award in 2006 and the District III Distinguished Service Award in 2010.

The students know Terry for his countless contributions and professional organizations of Idaho but his greatest influence may very well be his willingness to step in and help wherever he is needed. Terry continues to host district and state tournaments for the IHSAA with the student-participants remaining his number one priority.

Since his retirement in 2012, Terry spends his free time with his wife, Lori, traveling to see his kids and grandkids, meeting up with the “old guys” for coffee, and continuing to help with the 3A State Baseball Tournament and serving the District III Coaches Association.
