The Consent Agenda, which included Minutes from the January 20, 2015 Board of Directors Meeting, the January 1, 2015 – March 31, 2015 financial report, 2015 Girls & Boys State Basketball Tournament Reimbursements, 2015 State Wrestling Reimbursements for Dist. I-II and IHSAA Board of Directors Action via Phone, Email, Fax was approved.

### REPORT AGENDA

## Y.E.A. Update

Dick Curtis gave an update on the YEA foundation. The account portfolio is at 3.5 million. Reimbursements for this school year will total approximately \$120,000. Jamboree income is at an all-time high, which is most likely due to more baseball and softball jamborees. The YEA board meeting was moved to May. They are dealing with legal and by-law / articles of incorporation issues. Revisiting the investment policy is also a subject they will be addressing. Five schools - AF, Century, Hagerman, Troy, Wendell – are close to being fully vested. There are 57 fully vested schools. AD's may check jamboree credits on the YEA website.

# 2015 Girls Real Dairy Shoot-out

Ty Jones reported on the girls' state basketball tournament held in February. The 5A site showed an increase of \$6,000 over the previous year, largely due to local teams qualifying for the tournament and competing in the championship games.

# **2015 State Wrestling Tournament**

Ty Jones reported on the State Wrestling Tournament held in Pocatello at Holt Arena. Travis Bell did an outstanding job as the new manager of that event in Pocatello.

# **2015 Boys Real Dairy Shoot-out**

Ty Jones reported on the boys' state basketball tournament held in March. Revenue was down at the Ford Idaho Center, which is likely due to few local teams playing in the championship games.

### **Web Casting IHSAA Winter State Tournaments**

Ty Jones reported on the webcasting of the winter tournaments by Idahosports.com. Information contained the number of games /days webcasted for each tournament and the number of viewers. Also included were the viewer numbers from the past five years.

### **2015 State Debate**

Julie Hammons reported on the State Debate tournament held at Madison High School. Jeff Stoppenhagen acted as the IHSAA rep at that tournament. Expenses were up due to increasing the pay to tab-room people to \$75. The Debate coaches are reviewing the scoring for sweepstakes, not giving points until the break rounds.

#### 2015 State Dance and Cheer Championships

Julie Hammons reported on the State Dance and Cheer Championships held at the Ford Idaho Center. The format was changed this year. Gate was up due to the tournament being held on Friday-Saturday, rather than Thursday-Friday. Seventy-five percent of the coaches and administrators like the new format. Approximately 95 schools competed with 1700 participants.

#### **Schools of Excellence**

Julie Hammons reported on the mid-year standings of the Schools of Excellence program. This information is available on the website, idhsaa.org. AD's should review their totals and report any discrepancies. GPA reporting for spring sports and non athletic activities should be turned in by May 5. The self-evaluation portion of the program will be sent out within the next few weeks. This constitutes one-third of the points.

### **IHSAA Awards**

Julie Hammons reported on the following award programs: Interscholastic Star, recipients of the winter Sportsmanship Awards and the winners of the winter Academic Champions.

#### **IAAA Conference**

Tol Gropp reported on the IAAA conference held at the Riverside. Bruce Whitehead from the NIAAA attended the Section 8 meeting during that conference. Joleen Toone and Dean Satterfield were inducted into the Hall of Fame. 127 people attended – a record high.

# **IHSAA Board Members – Expired Terms**

Ty Jones reported on the following IHSAA board positions that have expired and those appointed to fill them. District II – Jeff Cirka from Potlatch HS; District IV – Ron Anthony, Buhl SD; Superintendent – Open; Boys Athletic Coaches – Tim Perrigot (Re-Elect); Speech Arts Teachers – Tracy Fuller (Re-Elect).

## **Committee Reports**

Ty Jones reported that the Representation and State Tournament committees met during the IHSAA board work session. Recommendations will be noted when the appropriate items are discussed. Since both the 2015 volleyball and cross country tournaments will be held in Districts I/II, hotel rooms will be an issue. Farragut State Park will be the site of State Cross Country.

# **Loomis and Lapann Insurance**

Ty Jones reported that the IHSAA will likely see an increase in catastrophic insurance premiums.

# **Section 8 NFHS Spirit of Sport Award**

Gary Brogan reported that the 2014 IHSA Spirit of Sport recipient, Hunter Gopp of Fruitland High School, will be the recipient of the NFHS Section 8 Spirit of Sport Award. He will be recognized by the NFHS in a future *High School Today* publication. Nominations for the 2015 IHSAA Spirit of Sport award are needed at this time.

#### **2014 Fall Sport Concussion Totals**

Ty Jones reported on the fall concussion survey. There were 151 member schools reporting. Schools need to enter their winter survey numbers now.

### **USA Football Conference**

Mike Federico of Twin Falls High School, Brody Birch of Teton High School, and Vince Mann of Borah High School attended the USA Football Heads-Up Conference. Participation numbers in football are decreasing nationwide. Making the game safer is a major focus. Certifying coaches allows for consistent techniques at all levels – youth through NFL.

#### **Rules and Regulations Manual**

Ty Jones reported that Rule 12, Participation in Special Events, and Rule 17-3-2, Rule of Two, were reviewed by the IHSAA board during the work session.

### ACTION AGENDA

#### **Ticket Prices**

Increasing individual ticket prices for all ticketed state events by \$1.00 beginning with the 2015-2016 school year was approved as a Final Reading.

# **Rule 5-12-2**

A request from Salmon River Jr/Sr High School to modify rule 5-12-2 to allow 8<sup>th</sup> graders to practice with high school teams was approved as a Final Reading. The wording for new Rule 5-12-2c. is as follows:

In the sports of volleyball and basketball, 1A Div. II teams may practice with 8<sup>th</sup> grade students if they cannot field enough athletes to have an inter squad scrimmage in game type conditions. The 8<sup>th</sup> graders must meet all other IHSAA requirements.

### **Hall of Fame**

Four individuals will be inducted into the IHSAA Hall of Fame. The inductees for 2015 are: John Billetz, Rosyln Brimhall, Ben Allen, Don Cotant.

# **Cross Country Hardships**

Modifying the existing hardship wording for a two-team district in cross country was approved as a Final Reading. The modification reads as follows:

Qualifying as a Team: The number of teams that qualify to the state meet shall be determined by the following procedure:

- 1 Teams that finish in the top one-half, or major portion thereof, of the full teams that complete the district meet shall qualify for the state meet. If a tie exists in the final qualifying position, both teams shall advance.
- 2. If a school is unable to participate as a full team in the district meet due to circumstances beyond their control (e.g. 5<sup>th</sup> runner is injured, bus breaks down, etc.), that school can be included in the count that determines the number of qualifying teams <u>provided</u> they competed as a full team (at least five members) in six meets during the regular season.
- 3. If only two full teams compete at the district meet, the second place team may be eligible for an at-large berth to the state meet by the following procedure:
  - a. The second place school submits an at-large qualifying request with the district tournament manager's approval to the IHSAA by 8:00 a.m. Sunday prior to the state meet.

A panel, composed of representatives from each district, will determine which, if any, teams should qualify by evaluating: 1) head to head competition with teams from their district and surrounding districts; 2) time average for the team's top five runners from their final five meets of the regular season.

## **Fall Sport Practice Model**

Modifying the Fall Sport Practice Model was approved as a First Reading. AD's will be notified specifically about the change. The proposed wording change is as follows:

#### Fall Sports Practice Model - Football only

During the fall football season, all student-athletes must adhere to the following practice regime.

- 1. Practice requirements
  - a. Schools may conduct multiple on-field practice sessions but student-athletes shall not engage in more than **four** hours of on-field practice activities each day. **Two practices a day (two-a-days) on consecutive days will not be allowed.**
  - b. Any practice session that is <u>less</u> than two hours in length must have at least two continuous hours of recovery time between the end of the first practice and the start of the next practice that day.
  - c. Each practice session will be a maximum of <u>2.5</u> hours in length, which starts as soon as the player is on the field. This includes all breaks, walkthroughs, conditioning, etc. Any practice that is more than two hours in length must have at least <u>2.5</u> continuous hours of recovery time between the end of the first practice and the start of the next practice that day.
  - d. There will be no more than 90 minutes of contact during practice per week. For the purposes of this rule, "contact" will be defined as drills run at the Thud and Live Action level. Drills run at the Air, Bags, and Control levels would not be considered contact. Definition of levels of contact include:
    - 1. Air: Players run a drill unopposed without contact.
    - 2. Bags: Drill is run at assigned speed until the moment of contact; one player is predetermined the "winner" by the coach. Contact remains above the waist and players stay on their feet.
    - 4. Thud: Drill is run at assigned speed through the moment of contact; no predetermined "winner". Contact remains above the waist, players stay on their feet, and a quick whistle ends the drill.
    - 5. Live Action: Drill is run in game-like conditions and is the only time that players are taken to the ground.
  - e. During the recovery time, student athletes may not engage in other physical activities (e.g., weight training, conditioning or 7 on 7).
  - f. All practices shall allow for water breaks and general acclimatization to hot and/or humid weather.
  - g. During the first two days of practice, helmets shall be the only piece of protective equipment athletes may wear.
  - h. During the next two days of practice, helmets and shoulder pads shall be the only pieces of protective equipment athletes may wear.
  - i. Beginning on day five, athletes may participate in full pads.
- 2. Participation in Jamborees/Contests

An individual shall become eligible to participate in a jamboree or interscholastic contest after completing a minimum of ten days of actual on-field practice.

#### Fall Sports Practice Model - Cross Country / Soccer

During the fall sports season, cross country and soccer athletes must adhere to the following practice regime:

- 1. Schools may conduct multiple on-field practice sessions but student-athletes shall not engage in more than **four** hours of on-field practice activities each day.
- 2. Any practice session that is <u>less</u> than two hours in length must have at least two continuous hours of recovery time between the end of the first practice and the start of the next practice that day.
- 3. Each practice session will be a maximum of <u>2.5</u> hours in length. Any practice that is more than two hours in length must have at least <u>2.5</u> continuous hours of recovery time between the end of the first practice and the start of the next practice that day.
- 4. During the recovery time, student athletes may not engage in other physical activities (e.g., weight training, conditioning or 7 on 7).
- 5. All practices shall allow for water breaks and general acclimatization to hot and/or humid weather.

### 2016 State Track

Representation to the 2016 State Track and Field Championships with modifications was approved as needed as a First Reading.

Sixteen (16) individuals per event/classification and eight (8) relays per classification will qualify for the state tournament. The representation per district and classification are as follows:

Moving the 2015-2016 possible sites for future state tournaments from Tentative to Approved with 1A DI volleyball site to remain at LCSC if they accept, otherwise it will move to Timberlake High School, was approved with modifications as needed as a Final Reading. Golf will be held in District III in 2016 – courses are needed.

Moving the 2016-2017 possible sites for future state tournaments from Suggested to Tentative with modifications as needed was approved as a First Reading.

#### **Mercy Rule**

Allowing the mercy rule for basketball to be in place at district tournaments was tabled to the June meeting, pending input from AD's statewide.

#### **Rule 4-3-4**

Modifying Rule 4-3-4 was approved as a First Reading.

The responsibility to enforce the penalty for being suspended lies with the school principal. Any dialogue concerning the suspension should come from the school principal and be directed to the President of the District Board of Control of the region in which the contest took place. The President of the District Board of Control (of the region in which the contest took place) may appoint a hearing committee to hear any appeals within 48 hours of the receipt of a complete report of the incident. It is the responsibility of the secretary of the District Board of Control in which the hearing took pace, to notify the district Board of Control secretary in which the student athlete or coach resides. Appeals may not deal with decisions made by contest officials.

# **Rollie Lane Tournament**

Allowing the Rollie Lane Wrestling tournament to count as one date for the 2015-2016 season only, was approved as a First Reading.

### **3A Boys Soccer**

Modifying the 2015 3A boys soccer representation, brackets and play-in games to mirror the girls' were changed as a FINAL Reading.

# **DISCUSSION AGENDA**

1. A request to make the use of softball facemasks mandatory was discussed. The High Country conference is asking to make the use of the mask mandatory for the pitcher and 3<sup>rd</sup> baseman. Masks cost approximately \$15-20.

This item was placed on the Action Agenda of the June board meeting.

2. The 2016 IAAA Conference being held in conjunction with the 2016 IHSAA April Board Meeting was discussed. The IHSAA meeting needs to move to April 5 -6.

Moving the 2016 IHSAA April board meeting to coincide with the IAAA conference was moved to the Action Agenda of the June board meeting.

- 3. The issue of fines for 4-3 Ejections by district Boards of Control was discussed. Ty Jones was instructed to consult the IHSAA attorney on this issue.
  - No Action was taken
- 4. Returning to contest limitations for Cross Country and Track prior to 2008 was discussed. No Action was taken
- 5. High school students participating in Junior Golf during the high school season was discussed. There is also a request that the start date for golf be moved to the Monday after the Friday start date for spring sports. Some golf courses do not allow high school teams to practice on that Friday.

No Action was taken on the Junior Golf issue.

The start date of golf was moved the Action Agenda of the June board meeting.

6. Moving the site of the district I-II 1A DI basketball play-in games to a neutral site was discussed. This item was moved to the Action Agenda of the June board meeting.
