NIAAA Meeting

Tol Gropp reported Idaho had approximately 20 people in attendance at the NIAAA meeting in Nashville, TN. Cass Herbst, CMAA, athletic administrator at East Valley Middle School in Nampa, received the Frank Kovaleski Professional Development Award.

NFHS Winter Meeting

Ty Jones reported on the meeting held in Bonita Springs, FL. The National High School Sports-Related Injury Surveillance System was highlighted in regards to high school sports injuries. Executive directors attended trainings on how to handle media, press releases and interviews related to state associations and high school sports and activities.

State Drama

Julie Hammons reported State Drama was held in District I at Coeur d'Alene High School. Expenses from District I tend to increase due to travel, which the financial report showed. Jared Helm, Coeur d'Alene High School drama coach, worked with a former student to create an incredible video for the NFHS campaign, *My Reason Why*.

2016 Fall Interscholastic Star Award recipients

Julie Hammons reported on the recipients of the fall Interscholastic Star Award. Applications were up which shows growing interest in this program. She encouraged schools to nominate one of their students for the spring selection. Spring deadline is April 10, 2017.

Committee Reports

<u>Representation Committee</u>: Ty Jones reported 2018 basketball and wrestling representation and play-in games (with the exception of 1ADI) are set. Julie Hammons reported the 3A soccer play-in games have been moved from District V (Pocatello) to District VI (Idaho Falls).

<u>Hall of Fame Committee</u>: Julie Hammons reported there were 16 nominees for the 2017 IHSAA Hall of Fame. Eight finalists have been selected by the committee and will be submitted to the state selection committee. Inductees for the Class of 2017 will be announced at the April Board meeting.

<u>State Tournament Committee</u>: Ty Jones reported the 2017 1ADII basketball play-in games will be in Moscow. Venue selection, in regards to home field advantage, field condition and grass vs. turf for state soccer was discussed but no changes were approved.

Swimming Update

Julie Hammons reported the District Boards of Control are working on selecting swimming rules interpreters for each district. Swimming will be a fall sport with an August 11 start date. The state event, which will not be IHSAA sponsored for 2017, will be held November 3 & 4, 2017 at the West YMCA in Boise. The max allowable number of contests is seven. Rules and Regulations will be ready for review by the April Board Meeting. For the 2017-18 school year, swimming will not be held to the *Rule of Two* (IHSAA Rule 17-2-3).

Idaho Army National Guard Partnership

Ty Jones reported the IHSAA has entered into a partnership with the Idaho Army National Guard for 2017. IANG will be the sponsor of the IHSAA Hall of Fame Banquet and the Schools of Excellence program.

Fact Finding Results

Ty Jones reviewed IHSAA policy on fact-finding results for appeals' hearings.

MaxPreps Pitch Count Entry Information

Ty Jones reported the IHSAA will require member schools to use MaxPreps for pitch count data collection. However, if coaches are already using their own pitch count data collection program or system, they may continue to use that, but must report totals on the MaxPreps site.

IHSAA Building Addition Update

Ty Jones reported the conditional use permit for the IHSAA building expansion was approved at the Planning and Zoning Commission Meeting on 1/17/17. Mid-February to early March is the intended start date for construction.

IHSAA Assistant Director Opening

Ty Jones reported a new assistant director position will be added to the IHSAA. The application will be posted on the IHSAA website, emailed to all superintendents, principals, and athletic directors as well as to other state associations.

IHSAA Rules & Regulations

Ty Jones reviewed Rule 8-9-7 Foreign Exchange Students and Rule 6 Contracts.

NFHS Coach of the Year

The NFHS Coaches Association selected Jeff Horsley of Soda Springs as a National Coach of the Year. Dr. David McClusky of Twin Falls received the National Coach Contributor Award.

ACTION AGENDA

"No Contact Rule" for IHSAA Activities

Gary Brogan moved, Tim Perrigot second to approve a "No Contact Rule" which states coaches will not be allowed to contact students from August 1 to the start date of fall sports for all IHSAA activities as a Final Reading. The modifications to Rule 17-2-4 and 17-1-5 are outlined below:

17-2-4 <u>Pre-Season Coaching</u> Coaches are not allowed to coach students of the school competitively (during competition) from August 1 to the start of that sport season during the school year. <u>Coaches cannot contact students during that same time</u>. <u>Winter and spring activities can</u> <u>contact students after the last starting date for fall activity practices</u>.

17-2-5 <u>Summer Programs</u> Summer programs must be voluntary and must be terminated by the last day of July. <u>Conditioning programs such as weightlifting and running may continue</u>. The IHSAA supports member schools' involvement in voluntary summer programs. However, the IHSAA believes that students need time off during the summer and strongly recommends that member schools schedule at least ten days of non-student contact during the summer each year.
